FRONT: Hermann's Arminius Statue

BACK: "In the year A.D. 9 the warrior Hermann, then known as Arminius, led an army of the northern Europeans to oppose a Roman intrusion in their homeland. In the ensuing Battle of the Teutoburg Forest, the annihilation of three Roman legions by Hermann's army has led historians to describe the battle as having changed the course of civilization. The City of Hermann proudly recognizes this hero as its namesake."

FRONT: Hermannhof Winery

BACK: Hermannhof Winery was established in 1852, has 10 stone cellars, and are among the 100 early Hermann buildings placed on the National Register of Historic places by the Federal government.

FRONT: Black Shire Distillery

BACK: The Rasche family established their farm and still in the 1840's on the same site as the Black Shire Distillery. They carry on that same proud tradition of crafting spirits from local ingredients aged in Missouri white oak casks.

BACK: This painting of George Husmann recognizes the significant role he played in helping to put Hermann, Missouri on the national map for its wine producing in the 1840's.

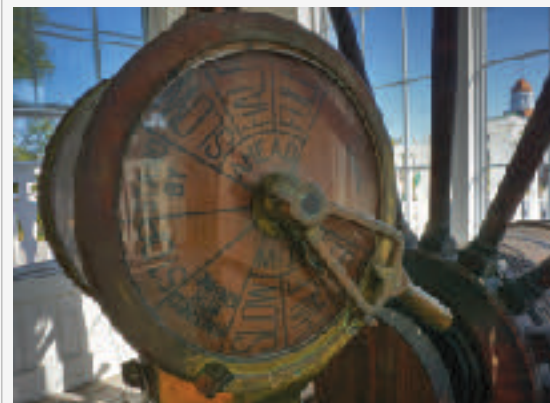

FRONT: St. Paul United Church of Christ

BACK: St. Paul United Church of Christ was the combination of two Protestant congregations and built in Nov. 1844.

FRONT: Steamboat River Memorial

BACK: Steamboat River Memorial was built in the shape of a steamboat providing a view of the Missouri River. Inside visitors will reportedly find the wheel of John Heckmann. Hermann is also the site where the "Big Hatchie" steamer exploded killing 35 in the 1840's.

FRONT: Gasconade County Courthouse
BACK: The Gasconade County Court House built in 1896 is one of the few in the U.S. built by private funds. Also on site is a Civil War cannon from 1864 used to defend Hermann from Confederate invaders.

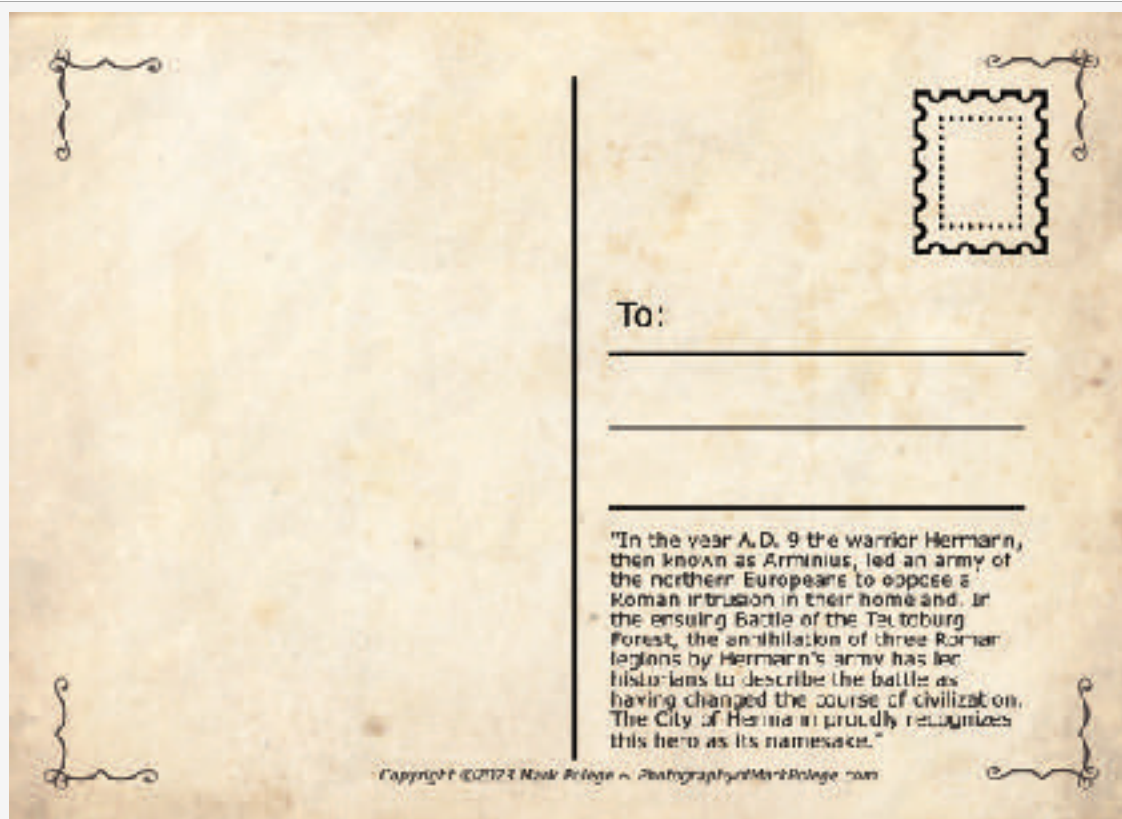
