FRONT: Hermann's Arminius Statue **BACK:** "In the year A.D. 9 the warrior Hermann, then known as Arminius, led an army of the northern Europeans to oppose a Roman intrusion in their homeland. In the ensuing Battle of the Teutoburg Forest, the annihilation of three Roman legions by Hermann's army has led historians to describe the battle as having changed the course of civilization. The City of Hermann proudly recognizes this hero as its namesake."

FRONT: Hermannhof Winery

BACK: Hermannhof Winery was established in 1852, has 10 stone cellars, and are among the 100 early Hermann buildings placed on the National Register of Historic places by the Federal government.
